## Infection Prevention and Control Plan (IPCP)

- Your plan will be reviewed with this checklist to ensure it contains all of the elements required in the California Health and Safety Code, Section 119313
- \_\_\_\_ Procedures for decontaminating and disinfecting environmental surfaces.
- Procedures for decontaminating, packaging, sterilizing, and storing reusable instruments.

Include procedures for addressing negative integrator results

- Procedures for protecting clean instrument and sterile instrument packs from exposure to dust and moisture during storage.
- \_\_\_\_ A set up and tear down procedure for any form of body art performed at the facility.
- \_\_\_\_ Techniques to prevent the contamination of instruments or the procedure site during the performance of body art.
- \_\_\_\_ Procedures for safe handling and disposal of sharps waste.

The IPCP shall be revised when changes are made in infection prevention \_\_\_\_\_ practices, procedures, or tasks.

- Onsite training on the facility's IPCP shall take place when tasks where occupational exposure may occur are initially assigned, any time there are changes in the procedures or tasks, and when new technology is adopted for use in the facility, but not less than once a year.
- \_\_\_\_ Records of training required pursuant to this section shall be maintained for three years and shall be available for inspection upon request of the enforcement officer.
